



SUNDAY November 10, 2019 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

What happens when we die? This is the question asked since homo sapiens began to walk upright and exhibit a marked level of spiritual sophistication. It is the same question that prompted the story of the mother and the seven brothers in the first reading, who faced brutal deaths while courageously believing that there was something better in the next life. In today's Gospel, the Sadducees are trying to prove a point on one of the "burning questions" of Jesus' time. Is there life after death? Does a man live on even if he has no sons to carry his name? As too



often happens, our questions, our visions, our expectations, are too narrow. What really matters comes in Jesus' final statement. God is a God of the living. Death is the pen-ultimate mystery.

Jesus never defined life after death. He preached more about life now and suggested that the quality of life after we die is directly related to how we lived here on earth. While Jesus does not give us a clear picture of what awaits us -grand vistas, celestial music, constant feasting, etc. ---Jesus does assure us that if we stay in relationship with God, nothing can destroy that bond, not even death. If you live on the right side of history, the end of this world is reason to rejoice! How does our faith and hope in our secure future with God affect our lives now? We can confront the challenges that face us without resurrection glasses. We can't pretend to understand resurrected life. However, we have two foundations for our hope: Jesus' own resurrection and his promise to us that we will share in it.

Hope in the resurrection gives meaning to our present lives and strengthens us in times of trial. With our Resurrection glasses we can view our world with a different perspective. From this perspective we ask ourselves: am I investing my energies in what will last or in mere fleeting joys? How am I spending my time in light of my lasting covenant with God? While Jesus notes how different the next age will be, our full participation in it is certainly affected by our present choices and priorities. We do have a future to look forward to- so what are we doing about it now?

The famous Preface for Christian Death sums up the matter beautifully when it prays: 'For your faithful people, Lord, life is changed, not ended.' But even though it is a new life we hope and expect to live, that life has already begun. It has begun now in our relationship with God. How important it is, then, to live in harmony with God here and now, to live in a loving way, to live in friendship with God! For, as a very wise saying has it: 'As we live, so we die. And as we die, so we stay!'
