## SUNDAY November 1, 2020 Solemnity of All Saint's

We are both saint and sinner. Saints because we are made in the image and likeness of God; we share in the Divine Life! Sinners because of our human condition; we are limited and falter. If we can appreciate and live into our saint, and accept and take responsibility for our sinner, then we can more easily live into the BE-attitudes Jesus speaks about in today's gospel.

The Beatitudes are a call to holiness, a call to discipleship, a call to BE Christ in the world. They are blessings from God, gifts to be desired and cultivated through prayer and right relationship. In living the Beatitudes, we are nurturing both saint and sinner. We are called to choose God, humility, meekness, mercy, and purity as we become more aware of how our pride, arrogance, and selfishness keep us from God. I John 3:2 promises, "Beloved, we are God's children now; what we will be has not yet been revealed. What we do know is this: when he is revealed, we will be like him".

As children of God, we are called to empty ourselves and pour all into God, becoming Christ-like. Like Jesus, the call to be **poor in spirit** is a letting go of self to a total reliance on God. Humility enables us to see our need for God's love, mercy and grace. Our poverty, brokenness, and sin lead us to God's compassion. When we **mourn** our sinful nature, we take ownership of our sins, trusting that God's love will lead us into a deeper relationship comforted by the Holy Spirit.

Possessing a meek nature means having a great strength that springs forth from God alone. To hunger and thirst for righteousness, for the kingdom of God, for holiness, for right relationship portrays a profound longing for God that endures and is never completely satisfied on this side of eternity.

Being **merciful** opens us up to feel the pain of others and take right action to relieve it. God did that for us when we were yet sinners (Romans 5:6-8). Having shown us mercy, Christ sends us into the world to be merciful. **Pure in heart** flows out of an undivided core – one devoted and committed completely to God. Psalm 24:3-4 says, "Who shall ascend the hill of the Lord? And who shall stand in his holy place? Someone who has clean hands and pure hearts."

As **peacemakers**, we are called to bring about peace by living the gospel values. We may be ridiculed, persecuted and suffer injustice for being faithful, but Jesus offers a blessing for **those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake.** Like Jesus, who suffered in this world, we will be vindicated in the next. Our call is to trust and hope in the promises of God, and as saint and sinner, appreciate and accept God's unconditional love for us.

A child once said that a saint was like a stained glass window. The different colours let in the light and every saint is a different colour of God. Every one of our unknown saints coloured God in a new way in his or her corner of the globe. On All Saints Day we are grateful for the lives of so many people of every age, church and century who have lived their lives as best they could within the vision and spirit of the gospel of Jesus Christ. On All Saints day, take some time to recall, reflect on, and thank the people that God has placed on our life's journey.

# Horizon of Hope – 2020 Bishop's Appeal Commitment Week - October 24<sup>th</sup> to 30<sup>th</sup>

The Bishop's Appeal is such a vital and worthy cause in our Diocese. But our parish benefits too. How does it work for us? We keep 20% of all funds raised by our parishioners up to the Diocesan goal of \$44,000. Anything raised over \$44,000, we keep 80% of that amount.

Why is the Bishop's Appeal so important? Not only are you helping our own parish but you are aiding other parishes that need help with essentials. With money raised last year, the Diocese was able to create a sustainable financial plan to get some of our parishes through one of the hardest times in our history. Who would have guessed last year, that funds raised during the Annual Appeal, would have been used this year to buy pandemic supplies for all our parishes? Signs, floor decals and communion plexiglass shields have been provided to all the churches. These Appeal funds have also been the life line that provides funding for our retired clergy, Religious Education, youth leadership training, and our First Nation's ministry.
