

Twinning with St. Patrick's Parish

SUNDAY - November 20th 2022Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

The celebration of Christ the King is a challenging celebration for many in today's church. The image of the King and his Kingdom offends some contemporary sensibilities—especially in democratized parts of the world, and for at least half of the human population: many women find the image particularly disturbing. To some, the image seems too militaristic, too triumphal, too undemocratic, hierarchical and certainly too patriarchal. Yet, the king presented in today's liturgy is nothing like what we've read about or heard kings are supposed to be like. The king Christians celebrate today seems, on the one hand, so much less than a real king or as I so often say, king backward. This feast day invites us to open our eyes to a new reality where nobility is not inherited but earned; where goodness is not assumed but demonstrated. That is the upside-down world of Christianity: Everyone is deemed worthy to sit at the table of the king, and the king, in turn, is servant to us all.

In Luke's writings, one of the most important words is *today*. It's the operative term for Luke's readers, who understand that the words and actions of Jesus have authority right now as they did in his generation. We might sit up straight and listen intently to the power that Luke means to convey in the phrase, "Today you will be with me in Paradise." This isn't a promise of heavenly reward for a life well lived. This is a covenant with a condemned criminal that, despite what he has done, the absolute authority of divine forgiveness is available and at work in the present hour to set him free.

If we understand Luke clearly, this story is our story. Luke is the only gospel writer who includes a "good thief" along with the bad one. The other gospel writers mention only the mockery of the others crucified with Jesus. Luke, whose constant theme is the forgiveness of sins, reveals that we are all condemned to suffer and die in our sins *unless* and *until* we ask to be held in the holy memory of Jesus. "Holy memory," as we know, is the Greek term for *anamnesis*, the power of the Eucharist that makes what we remember present now. If we want a share in the Kingdom of Jesus here and now, today, we will find it in this celebration of the forgiveness of sins. It is in our Eucharist that Jesus exercises his kingship, and all who are citizens of his reign come to this table.

It is easy to say: "Christ is my king". To make elaborate displays of homage. To sing triumphalist hymns. To pride ourselves on being "Christian". But are we willing to accept the invitation to live in his kingdom? We've spent the month of November thinking about the end of our lives, the end of the lives of those we love, the end of the very world and the universe that maintains and grows us. This final Sunday of our liturgical year is what the end will look like. You have a role to play: how? The hard fact for all of us is that Jesus presents us with a difficult example of how to use power and what power is for--service, not conquest. Think differently! Think love! In a nutshell, that is the simple message of the Gospel: think love, be love, Go and do! On this last Sunday of the Church year that's a good message... think love, be love!!!!
