SUNDAY November 24, 2019 34th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Christ the King Sunday is a feast that proclaims Jesus is the Christ, "the Anointed One", the Messiah". Today we read about the Solemnity of Christ the King and end the liturgical year "C". The feast is proclaiming Christ's royalty over each and every one of us, our families, society, governments and nations. Jesus is a king. His leadership is marked by service, humility and compassion. Our material world sees a different kind of king with sharp contrast to Jesus. The world leaderships have opulence, ambition, greed, hunger for power and disregard for common good. Clearly, today, the daily news leaves us with a feeling of utter dissatisfaction.

Thus Jesus, throughout his earthly ministry, modeled leadership of a spiritual nature rather than a materialistic one. He did not send out armies to shed blood, but he shed his own blood. The kingdom of God that Jesus proclaims represents a new reality and we are dual citizens of the world and of the kingdom of God (heaven). Jesus sends out his message of good news without swords or guns. It is a message of peace and love. He does not force, but invites. He relies on the response of those who understand his message to reach out and share with others.

My heart is touched by the way Jesus responded to the penitent thief. The thief was humble and already suffering the consequences of his sins. Jesus did not reprimand him. No judgments of good verses bad. Instead he says, "This day you will be with me in Paradise."

As Richard Rohr would say, "That is a king we would be proud to serve!" The kingdom of God is here now and we are subjects of this king. We move from a kingdom of darkness to a kingdom of light. With hope for the future we listen to the invisible God. We allow him to be our king. We proudly adore his cross. We read, hear and obey the messages in the Bible. We spend time in his presence; the Eucharist.

This is a time of many Graces. Jesus is the way, the truth, and the life. We are reminded that our spiritual growth is blessed by God doing it; in me, with me and as me; aka the channel of love. The pursuit of holiness is a process of letting Jesus into your heart. Personally I like to practice gratitude. Every day is filled with the wonders of our world and the people in it. I has always hoped to say an empathic 'yes' to God and so I happily practice with a little 'yes' in my daily prayers/talks with God.

Today is the last Sunday of Ordinary Time...just before the start of Advent. It is a time of hope and gratitude for all the blessings we receive. Is Jesus really the king of my life? With the material and spiritual worlds, can we live in the peace of Christ? Christ is our Redeemer who kindled hope in our hearts and offered unconditional forgiveness that opened the gates of heaven for us.

For this I am truly grateful.
