SUNDAY - November 27th 2022First Sunday of Advent

Today, November 27th, is the First Sunday of Advent and the beginning of the beautiful Advent season. This is the time of wreaths and candlelight, calendars and waiting, longer nights and stillness, preparing for Christmas. Yet, Matthew's Gospel for this Sunday is startling and unexpected. The flood came and swept them all away, and one will be taken and one will be left. What is going on here? Who would want to be left behind? Who would want to be swept away? We are only too aware of the power of water sweeping away buildings, animals, and people. The floods a year ago in British Columbia and the recent ones in Pakistan have left us with indelible images of the destruction by water. This can't really be the appropriate Gospel for the beginning of Advent! But Jesus finishes his words with a plea. Keep awake, therefore, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming . . . the Son of Man is coming at an unexpected hour.

These few words shift everything! Jesus does not meet us in our daily lives with trumpet blasts and flashing lights. He comes gently, quietly, as a tiny movement in our hearts. We could easily miss him, we often do. As we work side by side in the field some of us will notice Jesus' coming, some of us will not. Ron Rolheiser, OMI (a Canadian priest and author from Saskatchewan) clarifies this gentle approach. He explains that God respects our free will and chooses not to overwhelm us. God is always waiting, always inviting us to respond, but always unobtrusively. Nevertheless, Jesus' words in Matthew's Gospel let us know that God wants us to be awake so that we don't miss his coming, his invitation. God wants us to hear the Good News of his great mercy and love. God wants us to know that we are cherished and cared for. And if we are asleep, God will wait for us to wake up and take notice.

Jesus is asking us to be awake, aware, present! It doesn't matter if we are working the field or grinding flour. It doesn't matter whether we are sweeping the school gym, selling shoes, standing in the grocery line up or playing violin with the symphony. At any and every moment we are invited to be ready to meet God in our neighbor, in our friend or family member, in creation or the circumstances of our lives. We have a choice; we can be ready; we can keep awake.

Therefore, let us put on the amour of light as St. Paul encourages us to do, and follow Isaiah who urges us to walk in the light of the Lord, for our Lord of infinite love and mercy, our Lord of light and joy is coming.
