### SUNDAY November 3, 2019 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time

God's magnanimity and all-inclusive love are themes of today's readings. Wisdom tells us God loves all things that are. Do you feel loved? Do you believe God loves all creation, no matter how different you are from other creatures? When do you find it most difficult to acknowledge God's love for yourself or others? What stirs in you an appreciation for God's love? Following in Zacchaeus' footsteps, what extreme measures have you taken to see God? What divine acts in your life have given you overwhelming joy?



Zacchaeus is described as a chief tax collector, which is about as low as you could go in the popular esteem of first-century Jericho citizenry. And the

moral value of his profession began in the basement as it was. When mentioned in the New Testament, tax collectors are usually paired in the same sentence with "sinners," "prostitutes," or "Gentiles." Any way you look at it, nobody's mothers wanted their babies to grow up to be tax collectors. There must have been something about Jesus and his message that gave Zacchaeus something all his money and power couldn't supply. Redemption is a matter of the heart. Zacchaeus' heart was in the right place. Jesus didn't come to Jericho to teach. Scripture says he was just passing through on his way to somewhere else. Zacchaeus wanted to see him—not to follow him or even to hear him but just to ogle him, as far as we are told. Zacchaeus was intent on getting head and shoulders above the rest to steal a glance at greatness. Even if it meant climbing into a tree and making a spectacle of himself in the process. Perhaps it never occurred to this businessman, panting from the exertion of running ahead and clambering up to his special spot, that Jesus might look up. Zacchaeus was perched up there to see, but not necessarily to be seen.

It may not have crossed his mind what it could mean to become visible—and vulnerable—to the power of holiness. But this is how miracles always take place: suddenly, unexpectedly, blessedly, and undeservedly. Salvation comes to Zacchaeus today because Kingdom time is always present, immediate, and satisfying, the very definition of "fulfillment." Jesus comes to stay with him "today" because salvation belongs neither to the past nor the future but is a constantly available reality that enters and empowers our lives in the only living moment there is, the one inhabited by will and decision, right now. The Kingdom came to Zacchaeus as a "now or never" proposition—which is precisely how it comes to us today. Whether we're up a tree or not. Despite all he had, deep in his heart, Zacchaeus wanted what Jesus was offering. Do you? The story of Zacchaeus reminds us that Jesus continues to call the strangest people from the strangest places. His story gives us hope. Every time Jesus looks up, He'll see all of us and say, "Come down quickly, for today I must stay at your house".
