Reflections from the Gospel Gals

Jesus teaches that the first and second commandments are the greatest and here are his powerful words;

"The first is, "Hear, O Israel: the Lord our God, the Lord is one; you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength."

"The second is this, 'You shall love your neighbour as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these."

Our Christian religion gives us a solid foundation with the Ten Commandments. These first two are the greatest with all others remaining an expression of them. Simply, we are to live our lives by:

I. Love of God 2. Love of neighbour

How do we love God? My father would remind us to live each day... knowing, loving and serving the Lord our God. Loving God is a manifestation of our faith. He created us and loves us. Many saints say that the love of God centers on developing a personal, loving relationship with Jesus. We can express our love with simple prayers of adoration, thanking and being grateful for all God has done and for all God is doing for us. Our modern day Saint Faustina wrote "...one thing alone is necessary; that the sinner set ajar the door of his heart, be it ever so little, to let in a ray of God's merciful grace, and then God will do the rest." (No.1507)

How do we love our neighbour? True love is not theoretical but pragmatic...meaning to deal with things sensibly and realistically. As my friend says, "It means doing some good for somebody." Our neighbours come from different backgrounds and ages, they bring countless gifts, burdens, needs and hopes. We don't have to take on the whole world. Just do one small act of kindness at a time. We can offer a simple smile, acceptance, encouragement, a few kind words. Guided by the Holy Spirit, we may never realize the far-reaching consequences. Many, many people in our parish freely give of themselves with ideas, counsel, friendship, support and faith that help others in their journey. We may touch a life lovingly and then perhaps the ripple effect of God's goodness will be shared and spread.

We have just celebrated All Souls Day that apparently has been also named the Act of Kindness Day. It is wonderful to emphasize the love of our neighbour, as we try to catch the moments to 'pass it along.' On our journey, of this earthly Kingdom of God, perhaps we see God a little more clearly and our hearts are moved to follow him a little more closely. Loving him with our service and respect and adoration, we too have received God's graces and divine mercy. We have believed and decided to follow Jesus. Our loving God reveals himself to all with his goodness and faithfulness, and thus our hearts lift up to God's Heavenly Kingdom.

A potpourri of great reading --- books most often signed out.

- -Mere Christianity by C S Lewis (famed popularly for the Chronicles of Narnia). On Right and Wrong, the meaning of the universe, belief & behaviour. Lewis, ranking with Chesterton as a great apologist for Christianity.
- -Becoming Human by Jean Vanier; the founder of l'Arche reminds us of what the "examined life" means.
- -A Daughter's Love by John Guy, a foremost British historian tells us how Thomas More's daughter, Meg, bravely supported him during his imprisonment and eventual execution by Henry VIII.
- -In the Steps of St. Paul by H V Morton (in 1934-35 with Paul's letters in hand): the paths taken, and the villages and cities visited --- Corinth, Athens, Antioch, Ephesus, Jerusalem etc. --- barely thirty lifetimes ago. A remarkable travelogue, by a famous travel writer.
- <u>-Cities of God</u> by Rodney Stark tells us, and with evidence, how Christianity became an urban movement and conquered Rome within three centuries. How and why did Christianity spread so quickly.
