Malachi has strong words for the religious leaders for his time. The perils of being a leader are many and played out daily in our media savvy world. Politicians, civil servants, and business and religious leaders get

themselves into trouble when they hold themselves fatherwilling above accepted and expected moral and ethical

standards. Not a day goes by where we don't read in the newspaper or hear on the nightly news the sorry story of someone abusing their authority or taking unfair advantage of their position.

What should we expect of our leaders? I think we should expect from our leaders what we expect from ourselves. Every leader starts by leading themselves. How do we lead ourselves? I have reflected much on the question of leadership in recent months, and on my own leadership under the watchful eye of my Lord and my God.

In times of tension, I always focus on trying to do the right thing? I see my role as pastor as a leader at the service of mission. This is my worldview and underscores my pastoral approach as I lead the people of God at this parish. I try to make good judgments (which I think is a good definition of a leader) and live with the tension of those decisions as they are lived out in community. I listen to the culture 5:00pm and narrative of the community and try to make decisions for the common good as a leader at the service of mission. Is it always easy? No! As someone once said, you can never be a good leader unless you are comfortable in your own shoes. My shoes are a snug fit!

Dear friends, we are inside-out people as human beings. We are in 9:00am contradiction when we go outside-in. The question is not about "do I wear a cross", but rather "Do I bear the cross?" It is not whether I go to mass or celebrate the No Mass liturgy, but do I get sent out to live what I have received. We don't have to hide! RESTORATIVE JUSTICE WEEK

Nov. 19 to 26 is Restorative Justice Week. What is restorative justice? "Just lock him up and throw away the key!" That's retributive justice. Restorative justice shifts the focus from punishing the wrongdoer to mediating a restitution agreement involving the victim, the wrongdoer and the community, aimed at healing of all involved. It was practiced in the early church and is a traditional practice among some First Nations peoples. Curious to know how this works?
