# **SUNDAY - November 5, 2023**Thirty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time

God calls us to remember and live into our covenantal relationship, a relationship where we are God's chosen people and our focus is on God's loving ways. We know God is faithful, compassionate and merciful, offering us eternal life and the indwelling Spirit. God makes, keeps, and fulfills this relationship; it's us who falter and lose our focus when the lure of the world gives our egos and self-glorification the garish spotlight.

Christ, the Word of God, renews our hearts and fills us with intimate knowledge of God. Through his teachings, his relationships, his actions, his silence, we come to know a God who humbly serves the world, and we are called to do the same. Jesus shows us how to BE in the world: "I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit in you; I will remove from you your heart of stone and give you a heart of flesh. And I will put my Spirit in you and move you to follow my decrees and be careful to keep my laws" (Ezekiel 36:26-27). Can we abandon fear, pride, judgment, laziness, bitterness, and apathy in order to give God our true selves, our whole selves?

As Paul ministers to the Thessalonians, his confidence in the power of the Word of God to transform lives is palpable. Paul knows, for he lives out of his own conversion experience! His relationship with Christ fulfills him and love flows out of him to all the communities he encounters. He abandons his whole self and immerses his whole being to bring about God's kingdom. Do we help guide, strengthen, and bless others to grow in faith? As disciples of Christ, we are called to do our part.

Matthew asks if we recognize the Pharisee within. Do we imitate the leadership philosophy and style of the scribes and Pharisees or Jesus' leadership style? Do we burden our children and family through eyes of judgment, using shame and guilt? Does our faith give us wings to fly or a weight that pulls us down? Is our relationship with God a matter of love or law? Jesus offers love, light, compassion, rest...a yoke that is shared. With gifts given, each of us are called to build God's kingdom.

# Cardinal John Dearden of Detroit offered this prayer in 1979

It helps, now and then, to step back and take a long view.

The kingdom is not only beyond our efforts,

it is even beyond our vision.

We accomplish in our lifetime only a tiny fraction of the magnificent enterprise that is God's work.

Nothing we do is complete,

which is a way of saying that the Kingdom always lies beyond us.

No statement says all that could be said.

No prayer fully expresses our faith.

No confession brings perfection.

No pastoral visit brings wholeness.

No program accomplishes the Church's mission.

No set of goals and objectives includes everything.

This is what we are about.

We plant the seeds that one day will grow.

We water seeds already planted, knowing that they hold future promise.

We lay foundations that will need further development.

We provide yeast that produces far beyond our capabilities.

We cannot do everything, and there is a sense of liberation in realizing that.

This enables us to do something, and to do it very well. It may be incomplete, but it is a beginning, a step along the way, an opportunity for the Lord's grace to enter and do the rect.

We may never see the end results, but that is the difference between the master builder and the worker.

We are workers, not master builders; ministers, not messiahs. We are prophets of a future not our own.

**Remembrance Day** commemorates some of the most memorable literary moments of an earlier time. Consider the famous poem In Flanders Fields by the Canadian physician Lieutenant Colonel John McCrae, who died some months before the war ended. And again, the English poet Wilfred Owen, who died in battle a week before the armistice, who gave us his dark, sardonic take on the foolish enthusiasm of war in <u>Dulce et Decorum Est.</u> In novels: Erich Maria Remarque, a veteran of the German army in <u>All Quiet on the Western Front</u> and Robert Graves, in <u>Good-Bye to All That</u> recount their war-front experiences. Closely in liturgical time is St Crispin's feast day Oct 25 which Shakespeare used in Henry V to spell out the consequences of war "if the cause be not good" when the English troops were confronting the French at Agincourt in 1415.

The 365 voting members of the assembly, which for the first time includes lay men and women, have released a Letter to the People of God giving thanks for their experience, detailing their work, and expressing their hope for the coming month.
