# **SUNDAY - November 6th 2022**Thirty-Second Sunday of Ordinary Time

Have you ever noticed how God tries to raise us up...our eyes, our thoughts, our hearts...every day? Each day the beauty of creation envelops us and offers a feast for our senses; each day the joy and delight of children, those young at heart, and the antics of animals shows us how to be in the moment; each day the urgings of the Spirit reminds us of someone or thoughts float through our hearts to call or reach out. Do we see God's love...hear God whisper...feel God's kisses? What are we focused on? How do we respond?

Jesus lived His life fully here on earth. He knew scripture, he knew the laws that governed life, He knew the burdens, the heaviness, the suffering of all of creation, AND he constantly, consciously, and faithfully took time to be with God, to deepen his relationship with God, to empty himself and be filled with God's mercy and love. He said yes to the transformative love of God and became God's compassion and truth here, now. Jesus shows us the way, the truth and the life, so let "the Lord direct your hearts to the love of God and to the steadfastness of Christ".

We are resurrection people that live a covenantal relationship! Do we live in that truth here, right now? We know scripture, we know the Paschal story and the resurrection stories. Let us "cherish the hope God gives of being raised by Him" now and at the hour of our death. We are not put on earth to tick boxes and 'wait' until we die so we can have eternal life with God. Jesus shows us how to live, how to be in relationship with God, how to treat one another, to be Christ-like here, now. Jesus calls for a conversion of heart, a circumcised heart, 'a broken and contrite heart,' a heart placed in the Potter's hands to be molded and fashioned into the heart of Christ.

Life is not terminated by our physical death. Our death is a transition into eternal life. All those who have gone before us are waiting for us. The saints, the martyrs, our family and friends, *all my relations* are witnesses to the truth of our living God, to the truth of eternal life. We pray with conviction for the repose of the souls of all who have gone before us; we pray to the saints and martyrs to help us put one foot in front of the other; we pray to the Spirit to direct and guide us to rise each day in Christ's light so we live in anticipation of the final rise in glory to eternal life. Like the martyrs before us, we are part of something so much greater than ourselves!

Do we believe in our own personal resurrection? When we do, we live our lives differently here. Each day we ask God to raise us up; each day we say yes to God; each day we surrender and flow into God. We trust, hope, and believe in God's promise that "the King of the universe will raise us up to an everlasting renewal of life." Jesus took on our humanity to carry us beyond death to a new place in heaven where we become one, as we fall deeper and deeper in LOVE!
