SUNDAY November 8, 2020 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

This past week, we priests had three zoom study days on Covid redemption. We explored all the losses we are experiencing because of Covid 19, and we named our feelings and needs; and we were able to share with each other how Covid 19 has affected us all in unique and different ways. We then explored stress management skills that can help us move through the current stress, and, as well, explored our emotional strengths which help us manoeuvre through this pandemic and find balance and perspective. The two priests, who led our study groups, were "wisdom people" for us this week, and it struck me how blessed we were to be given this time to examine how we are coping so far. It struck me as people of faith, we have many resources to help us move forward. We are here today because, as people of faith, we know we can put our landscapes right here... at the word and table of mercy where unconditional love is freely given! Such wisdom!

Wisdom is the central theme of today's readings. The wedding banquet is a regular image of eternal life in the Gospels. The wedding banquet is a consistent image of eternal life in the New Testament. We can only speak about the unknown and unfamiliar in terms of what is known and familiar. The wedding banquet highlights eternal life as that state in which the deepest hunger and thirst in our lives will be satisfied, especially the hunger and thirst for love, for God who is love.

The refusal of the wise virgins to share may appear selfish. But here we are not talking really about lamps and oil but about people and life. We need wisdom people in our lives, people whose wisdom guides us on our pilgrim way. What wisdom can the church and Christianity offer this culture? Well, Christ tells us that we are not alone and that we have not been abandoned, and all we need to do is call out his name. We, as baptized disciples of Jesus, must be confident and proud of our faith. We have something to offer this world and it is a pearl of great price, it is <u>wisdom</u>. The bridegroom is coming, and the wise virgins are the ones who are ready for him. Which is to say: God's wisdom is always searching for us, but we also must look for it to see it. The Lord is coming at any time, but we still must be watchful for him. What gives us this sight? One little word: love. If we love God, God will know He is welcome in our lives. Let us ask ourselves: How is God looking for me?

Dear friends, when we are faithful to the relationship with God, we put oil in our lamps for when we need it. Moral courage is stored there, as is access to wisdom, compassion, and the willingness for self-sacrifice. When darkness arrives like Covid 19, and the oil is required, it will be there for us. One thing is certain: The hour of darkness comes into every life. We will have to wrestle with loss and loneliness, failure and betrayal, fear and weakness, anxiety for those we love trapped in the web of human brokenness.

LIBRARY CORNER

Wednesday, November 11.2018 Remembrance Day has inspired some of the most memorable literary moments of that time. Consider the famous poem. In Flanders Fields, by the Canadian physician—Lieutenant Colonel John McCrae, who died some months before the war ended. And again, the English poet Wilfred Owen, who died in battle a week before the armistice, who gave us his dark, sardonic take on the foolish



enthusiasm of war in <u>Dulce et Decorum Est.</u> In novels: <u>Erich Maria Remarque</u>, a veteran of the German army in <u>All Quiet on the Western Front</u> and Robert Graves, in <u>Good-Bye to All That</u> recount their war-front experiences. Closely in time is St Crispin's feast day, Oct 25, which Shakespeare used for Henry V's famous speech to English troops confronting the French at Agincourt in 1415.
