SUNDAY October 11, 2020 Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

If we learned nothing else this year, it is that circumstances change. Covid has stopped us from the routine of our lives! It reminds us of historical truths...civilizations come and go and time changes everything! Societies come together and shatter apart. Wellness comes and goes. Markets rise and fall, and politicians will rise and fall. War and peace exchange places. People climb up and down the ladder of success. What does tomorrow hold for us? What is there to hope for? Our imagination projects into the future...when will Covid end? In these pandemic times, today's Scriptures invite us all to raise our sights, and our hearts, when thinking of the future. Beyond this present life, God has planned a great future for all of us. Isaiah's prophecy of the heavenly banquet is an invitation to think of our eternal destiny. There is more to live for than what we see in this present world, interesting and challenging though it is. What really counts, indeed, is whether we succeed in reaching our eternal happiness with God.

Perhaps our predecessors in the faith had a stronger sense of the afterlife than we have today. Like Saint Paul, they believed that history is in God's hands and that divine justice will have the last say. Difficulties in one's present life could then be seen as growth-pains, or as a means of purifying the spirit from selfishness and sin. Paul – and many other men and women of faith – could be inwardly at peace, no matter how hard the circumstances in which they found themselves. We can "do all things in Him who strengthens us," if we hold on to the hope of everlasting life. We need to say these words too.... we can "do all things in Him who strengthens us," Jesus emphasizes that this wedding-banquet is open to all people indeed, that God sends his messengers out to scour the highways and byways in order to fill his house with guests.

It is a comforting thought that God wants us to be saved, even more than we do ourselves. On the other hand, there is a special regalia or wedding-garment that must be worn. Our wedding-garment is therefore being woven daily, by the quality of our interaction with others. In this sense, we hold tomorrow in our own hands, as with the help of God's grace we build our own eternal future. Thanksgiving is, perhaps, more than any other day, a day of memory. In this time of harvest, we have much to be thankful for and in the scheme of our lives, too, we have many reasons to be grateful—though we do not always focus on them. And so, we come to give thanks, so that we might be transformed. We celebrate a feast of Thanksgiving to remind us of the importance of approaching every day with gratitude, of receiving everything as gift.

In this time of Thanksgiving, I also want to thank the hardworking members of our Diocesan Appeal Committee, and as we look towards the Horizon of Hope campaign I pray we will be generous as we endeavor to build Christian community in these pandemic days.
