Twinning with St. Patrick's Parish

SUNDAY - October 16th 2022Twenty-ninth Sunday of Ordinary Time

The theme of food continues in this time of harvest as we celebrate World Food Day. Most of us are glad to sit down and dig in. Yet for 800 million people worldwide, there isn't enough to eat. Nearly 40 percent of the world community can only afford nutrient-poor diets. The medical costs associated with unhealthy diets will soon exceed \$1.3 trillion annually. The problem isn't growing enough food. Fourteen percent of each harvest is lost to bad handling, storage, and transit methods. Another 17 percent is lost at the consumer end; it simply goes bad or gets thrown away. World hunger is solvable with willingness, work, and prayer!

Fitting advice from Jesus in today's Gospel where he encourages his disciples to pray always and not to lose heart. I wonder what it is that prompted Jesus to exhort us along those lines. I think it stems from a very realistic look at the world in which we live. Food insecurity, inflation is taking a bite out of pocketbook and favorite foods. Where are you God? The praying that Jesus exhorts us to in these circumstances is the obstinate desire and longing for God's righteousness in our world; it is a passionate crying and searching for a world of justice, of peace, of unity, of love; it is a clinging to God against all the evidence to the contrary.

There are two aspects to this kind of praying that we must not lose sight of. We must stand by and support each other in that pleading to God. That is beautifully expressed in the image of the first reading, where Moses is described as growing exhausted in his pleading to God. It is only with the support of Aaron and Hur that Moses can hang on to and persevere in his dogged faith that God will vindicate his people. There is a second aspect to the kind of praying that Jesus exhorts us to. God will answer our prayer through us. He will, in the words of the second reading, equipped us fully and ready us for any good work.

When Jesus comes again, will he find faith on earth? That is a haunting question. Where would any of us go to seek faith—that is, to seek the people who put their trust radically in God's promises? Would we go to houses of prayer and worship? Would we go to monasteries and cloisters? Would we seek out those who have taken vows and sworn their lives over to the work of the church? Would we journey to the ends of the earth to where missionaries risk everything for the love of God? Jesus will find faith on earth in the same places and in the same proportions that the church takes it mission seriously—that we take our mission seriously as the people of God: to love each other, to be peacemakers, to care for our

least brothers and sisters, to show God's mercy, and to represent God's justice. The annoying widow in today's gospel exemplifies that spirit of mission. She will not give up, she will not desert her cause, no matter how long it takes, how exhausting the process, or how unlikely the results.
