We want you to do for us whatever we ask. Nice conversation starter! In the Gospel we hear today – as we have been hearing these past few weeks – we get yet another story of Disciples behaving badly, of Disciples not getting it, of Disciples missing the point that seems so obvious to us who listen with well-trained ears. Jesus has a different concept of "greatness" than "the world" does, than his disciples did... This is a recurring theme in the Gospels. In this chapter 10 of Mark's Gospel Jesus is fielding some pretty hard questions. That's what we've been listening to for the past three weeks. Jesus put on the spot with hard questions. Do you remember them? Pharisees, Rich young Man, his own disciples. But notice the dynamic in all three instances: Jesus listens to the question, better listens to the one who asks the questions, and then invites them to go beneath the surface to a much deeper reality.

Jesus listens to the question, or the questioner, reads the heart of the person and takes them to a deeper place: What's the question you would like to ask Jesus? The question I am asking is Jesus, why do things in life so often "unravel"? Relationships between good people, the things in life that we invest ourselves in, our work, our church, our society. This unraveling question is coming from my own heart this week, my pastoral realities this week has led to asking Jesus some deep questions: how do I respond? I don't always; I listen because I am called to listen. I just listen ... as Jesus listens.... And takes me to a deeper place. Imagine our lord and our God so attentive to others who don't get it. Jesus own life is unraveling. His hopes and dreams, everything he has invested in, save God. Ultimately God will be the thread that binds. Jesus speaks to us of his solidarity with the worlds' suffering, and our suffering. Jesus takes us to a place where he asks us to bind up wounds and be there as servants. What is that place? LOVE!!!!! Love is the space where God and I live together in one being.

That is the question Jesus puts to James and John; that is the question he puts to all of us, however we come to God and whatever we end up asking. "What do you wish?" is the question God asks us. Not "what have others taught you to want?" or "what do you think you ought to ask for?" but "what do you wish?" God asks that question because – hard as it may sometimes be to believe – that is what God wants so much to give to each of us: what will truly bring us happiness and wholeness, healing and a sense of purpose. We do not know at the beginning what following Christ will mean for us, and the way you do it will be different from the way I do. But however our lives become shaped, we trust ourselves to the promise: if we truly give of ourselves, God will not disappoint but the world will. Gandhi said it best...the things that will destroy us are politics without principle; pleasure without conscience; wealth without work; knowledge without character; business without morality; science without humanity; and worship without sacrifice.
