This weekend we are back in the vineyard though this time we are not with the workers, but with the owner's family. One lad agrees to work but doesn't, while the other refused to work, yet does. The basic message, so familiar from the life of any family, is simple and clear: when words and deeds do not match, it is the deeds which matter. Words

are important, deeds more so. We might win an

argument, yet convince no one. The most persuasive argument will always be our example. We can tell our children to be honest, but if they see us being dishonest, then they will learn the example, not the words. We can gather together each week and profess our faith, but if that does not make a difference to our lives, who will ever think it is something worth sharing.

Most families aim to be happy. While we may argue and accuse, take offense, assign blame, and carry grudges, our deeper goal is to celebrate that "complete joy" Saint Paul talks about. Our sovereign need to be personally right and to affix fault to others, however, is a serious obstacle to comprehensive happiness. Whose fault is it, anyway, and how does the assignment of blame help a situation along to final resolution? Which brings us back to our quarrelsome families, our divided nation, our fractured church, or our shattered global community, as you prefer. Which is the more vital task: to bury all opponents in the assignment of unassailable blame, or to 5:00pm seek the healing, peace, and reconciliation we all desperately require? One thing is sure. Our joy will not be complete until it is COMPLETE—that is, until everyone gets a share in it and has a reason to be happy. Each and every member of the people of God can know what God expects of them directly. And there's something more: God has already put the ability to know the ways of God "in your hearts."

This weekend, we celebrate Commitment Sunday in our parish for all of us who love and serve the Lord. Thank you for you generous witness to making lesus known and for all you do to build up the Body Of Christ. All God's creatures got a 9:00am place in the choir. Join me on the feast of St. Francis as we bless our beloved pets after mass on Tuesday.
