Twinning with St. Patrick's Parish

SUNDAY - October 1, 2023 Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The readings today portray how much God values life, our life, a life in Christ, a life working towards a greater good, fulfilling God's will, and responding to God's call. We see how Christ responds to God's invitation to work in God's vineyard. With humility, surrender, obedience, trust, and a willingness to serve the Other, Jesus places himself into God's hands, asking us to do the same. God's breath fills us with precious life, gifts freely given to us to do God's work here and now! So how do we respond? With a resounding yes as we go into the world ready to do God's work? With empty words, promises, or excuses? Lukewarm...sitting on the fence...hedging our bets? Do we even value the life God has given us?

We are reminded of God's abundant mercy and steadfast love for us, a mercy and love that is beyond our understanding, one that continuously envelops us no matter where we are on the road of life. God's compassion and forgiveness knocks on our *exiled* hearts. What '*barriers*' have we put up that keep us from God's loving embrace? Acts of rebellion, defiance, justification, finger pointing ... casting blame, claiming victimhood, living in the sin of Adam (we don't need God)? Not believing in our goodness and God's goodness? Not trusting and believing that God's sacrificial love destroyed death and all obstacles of separation in our relationship with God? Doubt and despair, darkness and isolation will grip our hearts *AND* God is there loving us through it all.

God challenges us to live life grounded in truth and responsibility. Only when we own up to and accept responsibility for our transgressions will we be free to fall into God's embrace. Repentance is not a burden, it's an active, deliberate, conscious choice to step forward into God's grace. Repentance is choosing life with God. We are people of the light. We know Christ. God urges us to choose life over death. Our foundation is a merciful, steadfast God who loves us, instructs us, and humbly serves, calling us to do the same.

A father asks his sons to 'go and work in the vineyard.' Why would he do that? He is the owner of the vineyard, his sons are the heirs! They don't need to work, do they? What is the purpose of this request? Think about it. How does work benefit us? It enables us to develop our skills and talents; it gives us a sense of purpose and self-respect; it creates friendships, relationships, and gives us a deeper understanding of people and cultures; it fosters unity, a sense of family working together for a greater good. Work is a gift and a blessing. The father knows the value of work. He knows that the work will benefit his sons and the others working in the vineyard.

In this gospel story, both sons respond with disrespect and defiance toward their father. Their words and actions portray a lack of commitment and accountability. Entitlement, maybe fear motivates them. What motivates us to choose life in God or life without God?

Take some time this week to really pray and reflect on your response to God, the barriers you put in place that cause separation, and what motivates you in it all. Look to Jesus, meditate on his response, posture, and motivation. No words are needed.
