



SUNDAY October 20, 2019 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Persistence in prayer is not always easy. We may lose heart during efforts that do not always yield short-term results. Prayer is not easy, but it is also not optional. With some support over the generations, our efforts can be built as living stones into something greater than we can imagine. Given that this is World Mission Sunday, it is good for us to reflect on the words of today's Gospel, we must pray always and not lose heart. The praying that Jesus exhorts us to in these circumstances is the obstinate desire and longing for God's righteousness in our world; it is a passionate crying and searching for a world of justice, of peace, of unity, of love; it is a clinging to God against all the



evidence to the contrary; it can even be a tear-filled groaning under the incomprehensible silence of God. It is the kind of praying that came over the lips of Jesus himself when he cried out: "My God, my God why have you forsaken me?"

When Jesus comes again, will he find faith on earth? That is a haunting question. Where would any of us go to seek faith—that is, to seek the people who put their trust radically in God's promises? Would we go to houses of prayer and worship? Would we go to monasteries and cloisters? Would we seek out those who have taken vows and sworn their lives over to the work of the church? Would we journey to the ends of the earth to where missionaries risk everything for the love of God? Jesus will find faith on earth in the same places and in the same proportions that the church takes it mission seriously—that we take our mission seriously as the people of God: to love each other, to be peacemakers, to care for our least brothers and sisters, to show God's mercy, and to represent God's justice. The annoying widow in today's gospel exemplifies that spirit of mission. She will not give up, she will not desert her cause, no matter how long it takes, how exhausting the process, or how unlikely the results.

At times in your life when you experience fear, anxiety, and doubt, you pray for the strength to move forward through these difficult periods. Saint Teresa, a 16th-century Carmelite nun (whose feast we celebrated this week), knew that path well, and in her prayer, she offers companionship and consolation on life's journey with God. As you go about your week, pray these words and allow your heart to rest in God: "Let nothing disturb you, let nothing frighten you, all things pass away: God never changes. Patience obtains all things, whoever has God lacks nothing; God alone suffices!

All saints began their conversion by prayer, and through prayer they persevered.

So, pray always and never lose heart! Fr. William Hann
