Reflections from the Gospel Gals

"Learn to understand more by not understanding than by understanding." John of the Cross

In today's Gospel, poor James and John have no clue what they are asking of Jesus.

They say, "Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you." Their focus is on what Jesus can do for them. I can't imagine saying those words to Jesus; but really, am I any different? What do I ask of Jesus? I ask Jesus to watch over my family and keep them safe ...and I have my expectations of what I need Jesus to do for me. Isn't that all about what I want? But, what about what Jesus wants from me?

We are told Jesus wants a relationship with us, and in a relationship, there are two sides, there is dialogue. It's not all about us. We need to sit in silence, so we can listen to what Jesus is saying to us ... if we are always asking, we will miss His whisper. I pray with faith and trust that we are open to listening for his voice and when we hear it, to have the courage to honor Him in our daily lives.

In the Gospel, James and John then go on to tell Jesus, "Grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your glory." I can imagine Jesus shaking his head on hearing this, knowing they still didn't understand that the way to His glory would involve suffering, sacrifice and a cross.

James and John loved Jesus, but they weren't thinking of Jesus, Peter, or any of the other disciples when they made their request. They wanted to follow Jesus, but they believed that Jesus would hold a royal position in Jerusalem and they wanted to sit next to Him, so the world could see them in positions of honor and power. But Jesus' way is not the way of the world and once again Jesus teaches the disciples, and us, what it means to follow him. Jesus asks, "Are you able to drink the cup that I drink, or be baptized with the baptism that I am baptized with?" James and John answered yes; they didn't understand what was involved in their promise or what was to come; all they knew was that they wanted to be with Jesus and share the cup and baptism Jesus was talking about. But, following Jesus is not easy. It wasn't for the disciples and it's harder and harder for us in this world where power and money rule.

Like the disciples when we drink of the cup and share in Jesus' baptism we are joined and grafted to Jesus. We become one. Jesus speaks to our heart and if we listen His love changes us ... when we open our hearts and trust Jesus, God's grace transforms us ... a little at a time ... and our world as we know it is turned upside down.

In our world the greater someone is the more they are served. In Jesus' world the greater someone is the more they serve. Jesus teaches us that those who are great in God's eye are not the ones we expect. We would never guess who they are by looking at them.

So, as St. Theresa of Calcutta once said, "Be kind and merciful. Let no one ever come to you without coming away better and happier. Be the living expression of God's kindness: kindness in your face, kindness in your eyes, kindness in your smile, kindness in your warm greeting Give them not only your care, but also your heart."
