From Fr. William's Desk

In todays Gospel Jesus snares the Pharisees in their own trap: their hypocrisy is revealed for all to see. The core line of Jesus' response: "Give therefore to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's", is often quoted. Some use it to discredit those who mix religion and politics or economics. Others take this line of Jesus to mean that there is a clear distinction

between our civic and political responsibilities on the

one hand, and our religious duties on the other. In other words, what we are about in this place on Sunday should have nothing to do with the political choice we make in life, and should be kept out of what we are about once we leave this place. [esus' answer is nuanced, and challenging. We get a sense of that when we take a closer look at the argument of Jesus. When Jesus says "and to God the things that are God's", we may wonder what he is referring to. If the coin is to be given to the emperor, because it bears the emperor's face, then that which bears God's face is to be given to God. What bears God's image? It is us! We are created in God's image; we carry God's face. That is the source of our dignity, and the basis of the task that is ours.

What follows is that we give ourselves back to God. What we owe God is not just an hour a week in church, not beautiful liturgies and endless prayers. All that is good, of course. What God really wants from us is a well organized, a well 5:00pm cared for human life because all of us are created in God's image. The kind of worship God expects from us is a society in which all human beings can live in freedom, in dignity, in justice, and in peace. That is the tax we owe to God.

But how do you suppose such a society comes about? Is such a society not built and shaped by the political and economic choices we make? Jesus wants to place our civic responsibilities in a religious context. When with our economic and political 9:00am choices we provide food for the hungry, shelter for the homeless, health care facilities for the sick, education for the underprivileged, then we are indeed given to God what belongs to God. It is all part of being our brothers and our sisters keepers. 9:00am That means as well that as long as our economic and political choices support insane agenda's, protect our own self interests, and keep adding to the relative affluence- at 9:00am the expense of those in need, then our worship of God is not yet complete and we have not yet paid our tax to him.
