Twinning with St. Patrick's Parish

SUNDAY - October 23rd 2022Thirtieth Sunday of Ordinary Time

Jesus surprised and upset his listeners when he told the parable of the Pharisee and the tax collector. Today's version would be, "The leading contributor to the parish finances and daily Mass attendee and drug addict went into church to pray." The Pharisee thanked God he was not like the tax collector. But in fact, he was like the tax collector. We all are. We all have the capacity to sin; we all have selfish impulses that run counter to our actual best interests. Because the tax collector was willing to acknowledge that and ask forgiveness, he went home justified in the eyes of God. That is something the Pharisee just could not see.

So, what is the difference between these men in the Gospel today? It is not their faith, because both are found at prayer in Temple. It is not their poverty or riches, because both would have been quite wealthy people. It is not age or education either. No. The difference is that one knows his need of God, and the other does not. One is aware of his failings, while the other is aware only of the failings of others. One can name his sins, while the other can name only sinners. One is full of contrition, while the other is blinded by pride. The Pharisee believes his goodness comes from his own efforts, while the tax collector knows that it is only the grace of God which can send him home in peace. Within these two characters lie you and I and may I suggest, all of humanity. We all need to take an honest look at ourselves. Both the Pharisee and the tax collector in the temple were sinners. But the tax collector, by admitting it, is the one upon whom Jesus will show mercy. We are all sinners. We need to place our sins honestly before our God, who loves us and treats us with mercy. God knows no favorites, Sirach tells us. He judges justly and affirms the right.

In these two figures of the Pharisee and the tax-collector, Jesus has characterized all of us. He does not put the Pharisee down, nor does he put the tax-collector on a pedestal. But he makes a judgment that goes contrary to our religious expectations. Because, humanly speaking, the Pharisee lives honestly and very conscientiously, while the tax-collector clearly has chosen the wrong path and breaks the religious code. And yet Jesus overturns our judgment and in doing so he forces us to take a good look at ourselves: are we intent on making ourselves perfect or do we acknowledge the correct relationship with God?

"God be merciful to me, a sinner." God has mercy on repentant sinners. The New Testament does not make that guarantee for the self-proclaimed righteous. Cornel West said it best...never forget that justice is what love looks like in public. On World Mission Sunday we need to remember that the world needs to see Christians burning, not with self-righteous fury and judgement, but with passion for God.
