SUNDAY October 25, 2020 Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

In today's gospel the religious leaders test Jesus. Trying to undermine him and his message and to flaunt their own knowledge and authority, they asked Jesus what the greatest commandment was. I can picture Jesus "looking upon him with love" as he answered his tester. Jesus' answer is familiar to us; we could flawlessly recite the two great commandments and we try to live by them: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind You shall love your neighbour as yourself". Love everyone in all things.

Reflecting upon this gospel, the question about driving-speed-limits in school zones came to mind. The question asks – why do you obey school zone speed limits. For some the answer is quick and simple; it's the law and if you break the law you'll get punished, get a speeding ticket – an 'ouch' to pocket book and budget. For some the answer is entirely different; they drive the speed limit to avoid hitting and injuring or killing a child who might run unexpectedly into the street to catch that errant ball in the heat of a recess game. Both answers are acceptable but not equal and both are rooted differently. The first is a head response based on literally following the rules and laws to avoid punishment or gain reward. It is about duty and responsibility, largely about <u>self</u>. The second answer reflects an integration of head and heart. There is knowledge, understanding and respect for the law but there is a deep seated love and concern for the other, love that propels action, action borne out of love. It is not about self or selfish motivation, and most certainly not about 'what's in it for me', 'what do I deserve to get from it'.

I fancy following God's two great commandments has the same two camps of motivation. There are those of us who follow God's commandments out of the same fear of punishment or hope and expectation of reward as those adhering to school zone speed limits, or for self-aggrandizement. There are those of us who follow God's commandments out of the same loving compassion and mercy as shown by Jesus. It is genuine, done in union with God who loved us to the cross and to resurrection.

St. Paul ventures to say that no matter what we do, without love whatever we do is for naught; it comes to nothing. He says we may speak eloquently, possess unmatched wisdom, have faith so deep we could actually work miracles, show extreme charity and generosity that could leave us paupers or obey God's great commandments to exacting standards BUT, and this is key, without love as the motivator, without love as the basis we have done nothing. When our lives are defined by love as Jesus commands us in his two great commandments we have chosen the "more excellent way". When we aspire to see God present – in everyone, in everything, in all of creation we can't help but be love in our everyday lives. In the unity of head and heart we find true peace, deep gladness and a knowing that brings joy and assurance.

Put very simply, and drawing on an old Christmas story, when we live God's commandments rooted in love and unity of head and heart, our heart, like that of the Grinch's, will grow "by three sizes that day", every day!

We are "companions on the journey" in the one spirit. Trudy H.

UPDATED AND REVISED PROTOCOLS AND DIRECTIVES

By now, most of you have seen the new directives from the Bishop of Victoria that came out last week. There are a few highlights that affect us directly at Holy Cross. Namely, music and "walk-in's".

Music: It is important to remember that, as unnatural as it seems during Mass, **congregational singing is not permitted**. It has been proven that germs spread faster and longer distances when there is singing. Music will be limited to a single cantor and an accompanist, and only they will sing an entrance, communion and recessional hymn. The rest of the Mass will be spoken.

"Walk-ins": Here at Holy Cross, this only applies to the Saturday and Sunday Masses. Each Mass has been designated a volunteer who will oversee the Mass list. If you are unable to attend your Mass on either Saturday or Sunday, you are asked to reach out to your Mass volunteer and let them know *in advance* so they can offer a seat to someone on the waitlist. There will be no "walk-ins", and only those on the waitlist will be offered empty seats. The maximum seating of 50 people will not change. Your Mass volunteer should be reaching out to you by email shortly to introduce details of this revise protocol in the coming days.
