SUNDAY October 27, 2019 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"God is love, and all who live in love, live in God"

Just as the judge and the widow of the last week's gospel are opposites, so are the Pharisee and the tax collector. Pharisees were members of an exacting party of the Jews who believed in strictly observing God's law, self-righteous and smug. The tax collectors followed another law, the law of the Roman oppressors. It was their job to collect taxes for the Romans. Tax collectors were hated because they were considered traitors and cheaters. It isn't hard to see the contrast between the two: the righteous Pharisee and the morally bankrupt tax collector.

"The Pharisee, standing by himself, was praying thus, 'God, I thank you that I am not like other people: thieves, rogues, adulterers, even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week: I give a tenth of all my income.' "

But his entire prayer is about himself. He thanks God, not for blessings, but that he isn't a sinner like others. He also reminds God of how pious he is, fasting and tithing.

The tax collector's prayer is short. "God, be merciful to me, a sinner!"

First, he addresses God, just as the Pharisee had done, but his prayer instead of telling God all the good things about himself, describes himself as a sinner. He makes no excuses for his behavior, offers no mitigating circumstances. He is confessing his sinfulness before God and taking full responsibility for it.

What strikes us is the difference in the way that each has approached God in prayer. The humility of the tax collector, standing at a distance from the Temple, not raising his eyes to heaven, beating his breast, asking for mercy .The Pharisee stood and prayed to himself. He asks God for nothing. In his mind, he already knows he is better than other people. What more could he ask of God than the high standing that he already enjoys? In his humility, the tax collector asks only for God's mercy.

The message in today's Gospel is to be humble and to pray with a pure heart.

Robert Michel, an Oblate priest says, "You must try to pray so that, in your prayer, you open yourself in such a way that sometime – perhaps not today, but sometime – you are able to hear God say to you: 'I love you!' These words, addressed to you by God, are the most important words you will ever hear because, before you hear them, nothing is ever completely right with you, but, after you hear them, something will be right in your life at a very deep level."

These are simple words, but they capture what we ultimately try to do when we "lift mind and heart to God" in prayer. We must put aside our egos. We mustn't let the sound of our own voices prevent us from hearing God speak to us. We need to open ourselves to God in such a way that we are capable of hearing God say to us, individually, "I love you!"

RESPONSIBLE MINISTRY

Responsible Ministry As part of the Diocese of Victoria's deep commitment to ensure the safety of children, youth and vulnerable adults entrusted to our care, the Diocese has contracted Praesidium Inc. to provide abuse prevention training through an online program entitled "Armatus: Learn to Protect". All members of the clergy, religious, employees and volunteers will now be required to complete this online training to ensure the safety of one and all. Volunteers have received an introductory email from our Parish Responsible Ministry Coordinator, followed shortly thereafter by an email from "Armatus Administrator" which will include a link to access the online program. The parish will start with ministry volunteers that have direct involvement with children and vulnerable adults, and then expand so that ALL ministry volunteers are contacted. For those without a computer, arrangements will be made to have the online training completed at the parish office. This is insurance for all of us and *all volunteers must complete this program without exception*.
