Twinning with St. Patrick's Parish

SUNDAY - October 27, 2024 Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

This Sunday, October 27th, is the 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time. The Gospel according to Mark tells the story of Bartimaeus, a blind beggar, and his encounter with Jesus. Sitting by the roadside, Bartimaeus called out to Jesus and Jesus invited him to come closer. When the blind beggar reached him, Jesus asked him what he wanted and Bartimaeus replied: My teacher, let me see again. Jesus responded with compassion, healed him, and said, Go; your faith has made you well. Bartimaeus must have been filled with wonder and joy and the scripture states that he followed Jesus on the way. There had been a crowd of people walking with Jesus. Initially, people in the crowd told the blind man to stop shouting, but when asked by Jesus, they helped Bartimaeus. Thus, they witnessed the healing and must have also been filled with wonder and joy. It had not been just one man that was blind. Many of the people in the crowd were blind as well, though not physically. Bartimaeus was blind but saw with his heart of faith and his heart recognized Jesus. Many in the crowd did not truly understand Jesus and were blind to the needs of the beggar. They were surprised that Jesus wanted to speak to him and were amazed at the healing, now able to see what they had not seen before.

All of us experience times of blindness. We do not recognize the needs of our neighbors. We do not see Jesus in the stranger. We become paralyzed by fear. We forget that we are the beloved. How can we see? Today's Gospel teaches us that our sight will improve if we follow Jesus. When Jesus said to the crowd: Call him here; the people did not understand. But they did not argue. They trusted and helped Bartimaeus reach Jesus. We must try to do the same! Jesus' words to all of us are: Love one another as I have loved you. (John 13:34) Trusting and following these words will help us be healed of blindness.

There is another important point in the account in Mark's Gospel. When Bartimaeus stood in front of Jesus, Jesus asked him: What do you want me to do for you? Jesus did not assume that Bartimaeus wanted to regain his sight but instead asked him what he wanted. Jesus did not force healing on the blind man. In the same way, Jesus invites us to follow him, but never forces himself on us. We live in uncertain times and cannot see into the future. With wars, acrimonious elections, climate change, and housing concerns, we have difficulty seeing our way forward. But we know that if we choose to follow Jesus, even if circumstances and future are enveloped by an impenetrable fog, our blindness will diminish. If we try to follow the words: Love one another as I have loved you, we will regain our sight. Therefore, let us in all situations, in all challenges, in all joys and sorrows, choose Jesus.

WORD OF THE WEEK:

Responsorial Psalm

Part of the Liturgy of the Word proclaimed in the Mass drawn from the Psalter (the Book of Psalms) or, more rarely, from biblical canticles. Sung responsively between the lector/cantor and the assembly. Follows the First Reading and corresponds thematically to the day's scriptures.

Through the singing of the Responsorial Psalm, we assent to how God's word heard in this particular liturgy is reshaping our identity.

CISDV – AGM: The Annual General Meeting (AGM) of the Catholic Independent Schools Diocese of Victoria (CISDV) Society will be held on **Wednesday, November 13, 2024.** There will be a private ballot election for two positions to the CISDV Board of Directors at this meeting. Each position is for a three-year term. Nomination forms may be requested from schools@cisdv.bc.ca and must be completed and sent to the Nomination Committee at schools@cisdv.bc.ca no later than Wednesday, November 6th. Potential Board Members must meet the following requirements for nomination:

- 1. Be a practising Catholic and an active member of a Catholic Parish in the Diocese of Victoria.
- 2. Not be an employee of the CISDV, an immediate relative of an employee of the CISDV, nor a student of a school under the jurisdiction of CISDV.
- 3. Read and understand the constitution and bylaws, policies 200 and 201 and the method of election.
- 4. Have a signed nomination form which includes two sponsors and Parish Priest.
