In today's Gospel we are confronted with the criterion in the light of which we may assess the intricate system of laws and regulations. And we may wonder: why? Why these admonitions? Why these laws? What is behind them? Are they just arbitrarily imposed on us? The reason for these admonitions and, in the final analysis, for the second

face of that all-important commandment of love is that every person is of immense value; every person is unique.

In the observance of the commandments, the real issue is always the dignity of the human person which must be respected and enhanced. And as believers we have even an additional stimulus: we are all created in the image and likeness of God. Therein lies the ground of our most profound dignity, but also the most profound dignity of every human being. Respect, reverence for another human being is in the final analysis respect, reverence for God, who has invested every human being with his or her own dignity. We are called as Christians to share that same perspective, to see the dignity in everyone. But we are also called to take it a step further. We are called to love all others as our neighbors and in that way, show our love for God.

One more thought! This message on the greatest commandment raises a question: Let's assume for the moment that our "love of God" is well grounded. That being the case, which of the remaining is the more difficult for you: love of neighbor or love of self? If love of neighbor is the more challenging, why so? Do you find you are impatient with others' shortcomings and limitations? Are there practices that will 9:00am help you cultivate greater patience and compassion? If love of self is the challenge, can you uncover some of the causes for this? Are there painful issues from your childhood or family relationships that have yet to be resolved? Healer of our every ill, guide us.
