SUNDAY - October 30th 2022 Thirty-First Sunday of Ordinary Time

Today, October 30th, is the 31st Sunday in Ordinary time. In Luke's Gospel we are introduced to a citizen of Jericho, Zacchaeus. He was a chief tax collector, rich, short of stature and according to people who knew him, he was a sinner. Because of his occupation, it is likely that Zacchaeus was shunned by many of the citizens of Jericho and felt isolated and despised. From Luke's description we know that Zacchaeus was curious about the preacher and healer that everyone was talking about and who was passing through Jericho. He was trying to see who Jesus was. And when he couldn't see Jesus, he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore tree. That's when Zacchaeus' life changed!

Zacchaeus was sitting in the sycamore tree when Jesus walked by, stopped, looked right at him, and called him by name. Zacchaeus must have been both elated and stunned; elated that this famous healer acknowledged him and stunned by the look in Jesus' eyes. It would have been an intense look of acceptance and love, not something Zacchaeus would often have experienced. And as the Gospel describes, Zacchaeus hurried to his house to welcome Jesus into his home.

It is easy to imagine that Zacchaeus served Jesus the best food and drink in the house, bread, fruit, wine, cheese. He probably was so thrilled he could hardly eat himself. He would have listened attentively to every word that Jesus spoke. He would have felt the spirit of love and compassion emanating from his guest. Even if Zacchaeus had not completely understood all that Jesus said, he would have perceived the gentle tone of voice, the caring and understanding manner. We don't know how long Jesus was in the house of Zacchaeus, but we know that this lonely and isolated man was profoundly transformed.

We know that Zacchaeus was healed, his heart overflowing with joy and peace because he promised Jesus to help the poor and make amends. Look, half of my possessions, Lord, I will give to the poor; and if I have defrauded anyone of anything, I will pay back four times as much. How amazing, this transformation of Zacchaeus! How could this have happened in only one day, one afternoon? Only through the power of love, Jesus' unconditional, merciful, compassionate, unending love.

Luke's Gospel brings us this beautiful and inspiring story. An unhappy and self-serving Zacchaeus was transformed by Jesus' love into a loving and caring human. But that is not the end of the story. Jesus continues to transform people. Jesus looks at all of us with the same loving, merciful gaze with which he looked at Zacchaeus. He looks at us continuously with love and compassion. When we become aware of that gaze and we let God's love flow into our hearts and souls, we, too, are transformed.
