SUNDAY - October 31, 2021 Thirty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time

Finding common ground with someone we disagree with takes a lot of effort. You have to be willing to truly listen. It's only by listening that we understand. And it's only when we seek to understand that we have a chance of a relationship with someone. In today's gospel we meet the wise scribe who shows us how it's done. Instead of being swayed by the crowd, he instead chooses to first listen to Jesus, so as to find common ground. He asks Jesus "Which commandment is the first of all?" Jesus tells him there are two. First, "Love the Lord your God", and second, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." In Jesus' reply, the scribe, the crowd, us, and all of our brothers and sisters find our common ground. It's love.

To love God and to love neighbor- seems so simple, but it's not. It takes a lifetime to figure it out. Jesus tells us we are to love God with all our heart, with all our soul, with all our mind, and with all our strength. In other words, we are to give ourselves completely to God, holding nothing back. To love Him in the same way His son Jesus loves him, and to love Him as he loves us. We are to love unconditionally. This is where it gets difficult. How do we begin to love like that? Jesus was perfect. We on the other hand not so much. To begin to love like Jesus, we first must listen to Him. The more we listen, the more we seek to know Him. It's in that seeking that we discover our weakness. And it's only when we admit our weakness that we let God in. God's love has a way of freeing us from the grip of our old selves. With the gift of God's love and grace, we are able to unlearn all those things that keep us from being merciful and compassionate disciples of Jesus. Is it easy? Definitely not! Like Saint Paul the Apostle, we too struggle with doing those things we don't want to do. But we are not alone in our struggle. God is with us, with a love that is patient and kind.

As parents we have experienced the joy of watching our children grow. Our Father in Heaven experiences that same joy in our transformation. He remembers our "first times" too. The first when we called Jesus our friend. The first time we chose to be silent, so as to keep the peace. The first time we let gossip die with us. The first time we said thank you for all the blessings in our day. The first time we looked at the stranger and recognized a child of God. With God's love there will be many more "firsts" to come. All we have to do is keep an open heart and open mind.

Henri Nouwen once said, "God loved you before you were born, and God will love you after you die. This is who you are whether you feel it or not. You belong to God from eternity to eternity. Life is just a little opportunity for you during a few years to say, "I love you, too." So let our love of God spill over into those we meet in our day.

Let us listen to others like Jesus listened, being fully present in the moment; knowing that our common ground with all our brothers and sisters is our Creator, our Father, our God of love. This is the essence of our faith.

RECONCILIATION CORNER

Watch this <u>47-minute documentary</u> on **Olive Dickason**, the **first** scholar to write the history of Indigenous peoples in **Canada**. Of Métis heritage, Dr. Dickason worked first as a journalist, then with the National Gallery of Canada, before becoming a Professor of History at the University of Alberta. Her ground-breaking book, *Canada's First Nations* (1992), gave an overview of Canadian Indigenous societies. She received the Order of Canada in 1996, and the National Aboriginal Achievement Award in 1997. This film, produced in 2002, is an illuminating documentary on a researcher who redefined how Canadian history is done. (Note that Dr. Dickason uses the term "Indians" in the film, a term replaced now by "First Nations people.")
