From Fr. William's Desk

For the third week we are in the vineyard. Two weeks ago, we heard about the labourers in the vineyard. Last week we heard about the sons of the vineyard owner, and this week it is the tenants, and the servants, who come to the forefront of our attention. Yet in each parable there is a constant figure in the background. We don't learn much

about him, but he is vital to all three stories. He, of

course, is the Vineyard owner. The parallels are obvious. The owner of the vineyard is the Father, God himself. He hires, pays, orders and owns. The vineyard is his. And the characters in the stories are us. The workers, the sons, the servants, and the rebellious tenants. At times good, at times bad, but always responsible to the Owners.

That is the vineyard, this reign of God that we are invited to be participants in. But we must remember that it really belongs to God. If anything, we are but tenants on the land. This means that we have obligations to the landowner. We are the vineyard of the Lord endangered by assaults from within and without. As our social and eco justice team ponder what it means to be a green parish we can listen to our Pope Francis speak about the invitation to care for the vineyard. In this era of climate change, the pope asks the same question in Laudato si': Are we willing to invest in the life of our planet?

This is the issue for our age, because if the planet dies, we die too. Enlightened self-interest alone would argue for getting serious about using, buying, discarding, and polluting less. While we might not have any affection for microscopic life forms, if enough of them perish, so do whales and other mammals we do care about, eventually. Pope Francis invites us to go beyond self-interest in our relationship to creation. He suggests that everything that lives and breathes gives 9:00am praise to the Lord.

Who are we to look away while one species after another vanishes; as glaciers shrink and oceans rise; as rainforests are sacrificed and with them, the future medicine chest of humanity? We don't have the right, says Pope Francis, to silence the voices of creation, eliminating each sequentially from the chorus of divine praise. 9:00am The pope's use of the word right is sternly aimed at democratic nations, which hold the language of rights as particularly sovereign. We don't possess this world. We're merely its present tenants, commissioned to surrender it to the future. We don't want to be the generation that says goodbye to the best friend humanity has. Thanksgiving is the memory of the heart. We have much to be thankful for! Father William
