Twinning with St. Patrick's Parish

SUNDAY - September 11th, 2022 *Twenty-fourth Sunday of Ordinary Time*

Lost sheep, coins, and children are valuable commodities each in their own way. But when Jesus tells parables about these missing items, he stresses two things more than their earthly value. One is the joy of regaining what is lost, on Earth and more so in heaven. The other is that being found is an apt metaphor for repentance. Both factors are related to the mercy of God and how sinners engage it. Because all of us are sinners, this is a good thing to understand. God loves the just but does not ignore the sinner, for whom there is always a place in his kingdom.

In our world today, the spirit of hatred, anger and revenge is alive and well. Proxy civil wars are stirred up and prolonged by outside powers, with masses of guns and weapons of mass destruction piled up and waiting to be used. Some have stockpiled chemical weapons while others have nuclear bombs enough to destroy the whole planet. How conflicted are the views of politicians who talk of spreading democracy but can rain down destruction from the safety of drones, high in the atmosphere.

On a more personal level, we all find it hard to forgive any wrongs inflicted on us by others. Perhaps the resented incident was deliberate, or it might have been unintentional. But it is sad if people must go through life harbouring grudges, making themselves miserable because they cannot let bygones be bygones. They need to consign to the past those hurts of the past, rather than still smoulder with unresolved resentment. These stories in the Gospel today help us move forward.

The woman who turns the house inside out to find the lost coin, the man who leaves the ninety-nine sheep to search for the one who has gone astray, the father who can hardly contain himself for joy at the return of his son, all these are images of what God is really like toward us. All are touching stories of being searched out by God and brought home into loving arms. It is the gentle concern of the shepherd, the woman, and the father to persevere in finding what was lost. We find the forgiveness of God, given out of love, without the sinner having to explain themselves. Forgiveness is the final form of love, and true forgiveness is always "God-like."

Can we accept that God offers mercy to everyone, no matter what they have done? If we are to be truly Christian, we must change our view of other people, and to see them as God does, with understanding and of mercy. The Prodigal Son story has no clear ending. We do not know if the elder brother eventually went in to join in the celebrations, or stayed outside, seething with self-righteousness. There is no ending, because it is not just a story, it is a challenge to each of us. How would *you* end the story? Would you go in or stay outside? Joyce Meyer said it best, mercy is the stuff you give to people that do not deserve it.

GVAT Homes for All Community Assembly

October 2 (Sunday), 7 - 8:30 pm (doors open at 6:30)

Christ Church Cathedral (930 Burdett Avenue)

On October 2, all 26 member organizations of Greater Victoria Acting Together (GVAT) will come together in person for the first time and demonstrate our collective power to the broader community. Holy Cross and St. Patrick's are excited to be part of this big action event, with Fr. William leading our delegations!

What is this Assembly about?

The deepening housing crisis touches so many people in our communities, from those experiencing homelessness to young families, single parents, workers, students, and seniors. Everyone deserves a home where they can live in security and within their means. This is a basic human right! Municipal elections are taking place on October 15. At the Assembly, GVAT will be asking mayoral candidates in the region to commit to bold policies that will preserve and create new non-profit and affordable housing for all our neighbours.

What will happen during the Assembly?

We will hear stories from people impacted by the housing crisis, then do a roll call of all member organizations – to show our strength and solidarity. Mayoral candidates present will be asked to pledge support for our asks.

What are we asking of our parishioners?

Show up at Christ Church Cathedral on October 2! Bring your family and friends. The higher the number of participants, the better we will convince the politicians that there is strong support for local governments to champion bold policies to quickly develop non-profit and affordable housing.

Why should you be there?

Even if you are securely and adequately housed yourself, think of all the people who aren't. Can your children and grandchildren afford to live near you? Do you have friends residing in older rental buildings who live in fear of renoviction or demoviction? Can the people whose services you rely on (eg. healthcare providers) find housing in core Victoria? Are you a business owner who cannot find workers, because there is no affordable housing for them close by?

All participants will be required to wear masks for the I ½-hour duration of the event. No refreshments will be served.
