Twinning with St. Patrick's Parish

SUNDAY - September 25th, 2022 *Twenty-sixth Sunday of Ordinary Time*

Today, September 25th, is the 26th Sunday in Ordinary time. In Luke's Gospel, Jesus shares a compelling parable, the story of Lazarus and the rich man. Lazarus lives in poverty and pain and after his death goes to heaven. The rich man lives in luxury and after his death suffers in a place far from heaven. The message seems clear. We should be sharing our riches with the poor and marginalized of our community and the world. We should be making sure that each person has food, shelter, and dignified work. But the question is why? Is it simply to avoid the fate of the rich man? Or do the words of Jesus have a greater significance.

What about the rich man? How could he ignore Lazarus? Jesus' words describe a vivid scene. We can picture it easily; the lonely, egocentric rich man, so self-absorbed that he does not notice the misery of Lazarus. And the rich man didn't just ignore Lazarus. According to Abraham, the rich man also ignored Moses and the prophets. Furthermore, given his lifestyle, it is evident that the rich man ignored the needs of all people around him. He ignored the humanness of his servants and slaves. He ignored the wide gap between his and his brothers' wealth and most of the people living in his community. He ignored the purpose of his life and what he could be contributing. He completely ignored that he could be making an extraordinary difference to Lazarus and many others. The rich man lived in luxury, but his life was empty. He was far from the peace and joy that he could have experienced if he had been aware, awake, paying attention to the suffering around him.

At times we all get caught up in the busyness and demands of our lives. We ignore the prophets and the messages from Jesus and close our eyes and minds to the suffering around us. We miss the opportunities to contribute to the common good, to make a difference in our families and communities. Eventually, if we don't open our eyes and minds to the living around us, we suffer sorrow and despair just as the rich man did.

This parable is as relevant today as it was two thousand years ago. Jesus reminds us to pay attention and rejoice that we can make a difference. We have been given the great privilege to help our brothers and sisters carry their burdens. We can share the many gifts we have received, not out of fear, but out of love, love of God and love of neighbor!

Today is the World Day of Migrants and Refugees. How blessed are we that we can help them build new lives. How blessed are we to be inspired by their courage and hope. How blessed are we to be awake.

Details will follow on what consistent weekends the Children's Liturgy will run on - if you would like to volunteer and have an up to date Criminal Record Check or are willing to get one, please contact the parish office.

Please note, that in addition to teachers we also need teacher helpers. In the meantime, there will be Children's Liturgy at the **Sunday 9am Mass on October 2nd**. Children's Liturgy is meant for school aged children aged 5-9. Children who participate should be able to contribute to discussion and participate in activities. During Children's Liturgy, children are brought to the parish library for an age-appropriate reading and reflection of the liturgy. They return to their parents after the homily.

Children who are in Grade Four and above are welcome to complete the RCIC program (Rite of Christian Initiation for Children) which is modeled on the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults Please note: Lessons for BOTH First Confession & Confirmation/First Eucharist will not begin until January 2023.
