Twinning with St. Patrick's Parish

SUNDAY - September 4th, 2022 *Twenty-third Sunday of Ordinary Time*

Are we willing to commit to Jesus' call to carry our cross, give up all our possessions, and follow Him? The readings today are calling us to reflect, to respond, to live in the world as God's beloved, and to choose Christ above all else. The cost of discipleship means letting go of self, seeing the world through God's eyes, and placing ourselves completely into God's hands.

Right living requires faith and trust in God. God's ways are beyond our understanding, yet through prayer and discernment, the urgings of the Holy Spirit, and our desire to do God's will, Wisdom will guide us into a deeper appreciation of who God is and the freedom God desires for us.

St. Paul reminds us that we are no longer slaves. Christ transforms us through His abundant love, mercy and forgiveness shattering the bonds of slavery. The cross of Christ brings about a new order, a new relationship that does not depend on any human classifications regarding master and slave; we are beloved sisters and brothers in Christ. God is our refuge. Fear and obligation gives way to serving Christ in freedom and joy.

Today we are asked to choose Christ. We are invited to examine all aspects of our life carefully and decide if the reward of eternal life in God's presence is more important than anything else. Jesus doesn't asks us to 'hate' our families. His use of hyperbolic language refers to 'primary allegiance', meaning our *primary* allegiance must be to Jesus first and foremost – the first commandment of loving God before all else.

Is there any relationship that comes ahead of Christ in our life? Is He the Lord of our plans, our thoughts, and of all that we do? Are we clinging to *our* plans, *our* way, instead of seeking to please Him in all things? How can we give our undivided loyalty to Jesus? Firstly, by **carrying our cross**, putting to death the things of this world – addiction to power, success, vanity, violence, our selfish desires, all the competing loyalties, so through Christ, we can gain a kingdom perspective. Secondly, by **following Christ** with total dedication and commitment, and in order to do that, we must *sit down and estimate the cost* and *sit down and consider* what we're getting into. We must discern all aspects of our discipleship journey rationally, prudently, and meticulously so we can commit to finishing the journey once we begin or not start the journey at all! Dedicated time with Jesus in Scripture, prayer, and devotion deepens our allegiance to Christ.

True discipleship demands our YES to God and our covenantal relationship with God; it's all or nothing. Jesus is there for us and does not require anything from us that He himself is not willing to give. To be His true disciples, His true followers, we must live our Christian life every day and all day.

We are called to live in the world as Christ lived in the world, by offering love, mercy and forgiveness. When we have been wronged and we can't offer forgiveness, we become enslaved by our

bitterness, our pride, and our revenge. Our own stubbornness blocks Christ's love! Accept God's forgiveness, let God's mercy lighten our hearts and bring peace to our relationships, so together in love, we can transform the world. Follow boldly!

NOTE FROM THE DIOCESE

Registration is now open for the first course of the Indigenous Pastoral and Lay Leader Ministry Education program.

Indigenous Pastoral and Lay Leader Ministry Education is an online continuing education program led by teams of Indigenous and non-Indigenous instructors. The program is jointly sponsored by the Roman Catholic Diocese of Saskatoon, St. Thomas More College and Greater Saskatoon Catholic Schools.

Course #1: Introduction to First Nations Studies will run on Tuesdays from 3:15-4:30 pm PST, Sept. 20 to Nov. 15. The other three courses in the program will run in 2023, and participants completing all four courses will earn an Indigenous Pastoral & Lay Leader Ministry Certificate. The fee for each course is \$200.
