Twinning with St. Patrick's Parish

SUNDAY - September 10, 2023 *Twenty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time*

Some years ago, a theologian noted that if Jesus were alive today, his enemies wouldn't bother to crucify him. They'd simply make fun of him in the press. There's a deep truth to that. The new execution style is character assassination. Once we've destroyed a person's good name, we have

effectively eliminated them.

A long time ago, Jesus argued, with good rabbinic tradition behind him, to settle disputes as privately and reasonably as possible. "Talk to your brother...(sister)," he advised. What a concept. Talk doesn't mean rant or disparage or shame or dominate. It means sharing and listening. But as Jesus knew well, you can't begin to settle serious conflicts by jumping into a dialogue without special training. Matthew 18 is an extended prep course in how Christians should handle their differences. A summary situates today's passage: Learn humility, love the lost, talk to your brother...(sister), and forgive without limits. So, how do we deal with members of the community who have been engaged in wrong, even sinful behavior? It suggests a procedure to be followed. The procedure that is suggested in today's Gospel is very demanding. For is it not true that when we come face to face with behavior that is unacceptable or that we may even call sinful, our first inclination is not to have anything to do with such persons? Or, if we are a bit more broadminded, we may look the other way, and pride ourselves on being tolerant. We prefer to stay out of it. After all, it is their problem. Let them stew in their own juice.

Today's Gospel is not satisfied with either one of these two procedures. It suggests a more creative approach, which is more difficult as well. It suggests we take responsibility for the brothers and sisters among us who fail. The way we take responsibility for them is not by writing them off or by remaining at a safe distance, but by admonishing and rebuking them. But in such a way that it is done discreetly, without intending to hurt, to break or humiliate them, without them having to lose face. To the age-old question of Cain: Am I my brother's or sister's keeper"? The Gospel says without hesitation: "Yes you are." To admonish others and to love them, to rebuke others and to respect their freedom: it can only be done by people who are schooled and matured in real Christian charity. The school of Christian charity is one that is life long.

I know that I have become a better human being because someone provided a hand to hold onto when I was afraid. I bet there is someone in your own life you helped grow because you patiently loved them. Aren't you glad you never gave up on them? Human beings are so fragile, did you ever stop to think that our simplest acts either display or betray the gospel mission to "love your neighbor as yourself"? Isaac, Cistercian abbot of l'Etoile writes...everything must be done or not done, changed or not changed on account of charity. Charity is the principle by which and the end toward which everything must be guided. There can be no sin in what is accomplished, in all truth, for it, and according to its spirit. September I I th is the anniversary of the largest terrorist attack in American history, is a day to call to mind those who rushed in to help, at great cost. The first certified fatality of the attacks was Father Mychal Judge, Franciscan friar, and New York City Fire Department chaplain, who rushed to the World Trade Center to help. During his life, he was known for ministering to the marginalized and for the words on a prayer card he often distributed: "Lord, take me where you want me to go. Let me meet who you want me to meet. Tell me what you want me to say. And keep me out of your way." Honor his legacy and make his humble prayer ours today.
