Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

It's amazing to think that the disciples were arguing about which of them was the greatest just after Jesus had told them—for the second time—of his Passion to come. The very thing Christ was talking about, the way of lowliness and submission was the exact opposite of their game of spiritual one-upmanship. Jesus opts for a complete reversal of the ordinary meaning of greatness. He takes the pecking order that holds our society together, turns it upside down, and introduces a new one which is the measure of greatness in God's kind of world.

The way to greatness in the Kingdom, as noted, is by entering into real community with the lowly. The trajectory of first to last, leader to servant, is a reliable one in the gospel. If we're not counted among the meek ourselves, we ought to make friends with those who are so that they might speak kindly about us on the Day of Judgment. Worldly success might have something to do with the ability to drop the names of the rich and famous. But as followers of Jesus, our goal is to have our names, or at least our intentions, on the lips of the humble when they offer thanksgiving for those who uphold their cause. When the disciples argued about who among them was first, Jesus placed a child in their midst—an irrelevant, powerless, nonperson by the standards of the ancient world. Not only does Jesus identify himself with such a shockingly negligible representative ("Whoever receives one such as this receives me"), but he also insists that when his disciples receive a child, God stands revealed in their midst.

The first are last, the leader is the servant, God is in the child—does any of this make sense? Not by worldly standards. Nor is such a vision compatible with the ambition of those who have much and would obtain more. If we want to embrace the Kingdom vision, we have to shake ourselves loose from the desire to climb, to possess, to be in charge, and to be invulnerable. The just one cannot protect himself or herself. The just have only the confidence of the word of God, and it is enough. Put the last first, Jesus says. That's an ambition worthy of discipleship. When Jesus embraces a child, he gives us an indication of what the measure of greatness is in the Kingdom of God. It is not power, but service that decides who is first in God's kingdom. By becoming servant to the least significant members of society, by devoting oneself to those who are least able to reward us for such service, we fulfill Jesus' mandate about true greatness.

Currently, 67% of children and youth in foster care in B. C. are Indigenous. For many, the foster care system is tantamount to a continuation of the residential school system.
