Reflections from the Gospel Gals

Mention the name Pharisee and descriptions quickly jump to mind -- hypocrite, self-righteous, judgemental. Such is the casting of the Pharisee in today's gospel. Yet, there is another side to the Pharisee. Go back through biblical history to the time when God gave the Commandments to his people. He told them not to add anything and not to take anything away. They were to be faithful to God in word and in deed - love God and love others. Many Pharisees were sincere; they practiced their faith and took care of widows, orphans and strangers. In their zeal they gradually added hundreds of rules, rituals and traditions which became heavy burdens upon the people and became the focus of worship. They believed all they had to do was to obey these rules. Over time they found reasons and ways to justify their growing lack of love and lack of mercy. In the end, they deceived themselves. They had all but forgotten God's commandments in favour of human tradition, ritual and ceremony, merciless justice and 'looking' holy.

Jesus did not condemn the Pharisees, but he did condemn their hearts. Of these He said, "This people honours me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me .... You abandon the commandment of God and hold to human tradition." Jesus was clear - the thing that matters is the condition of our heart. Then as now, those who are "doers of the word and not merely hearers" of the word are Disciple.

Rituals and rules can have their place in reverential worship. But, when rules, self-imposed or imposed by others, become the means by which we practice and judge our faith and belief and that of others, we are as Pharisee. We are not in relationship with Jesus. We are not a light for the world. As Pope Francis said, "a common temptation to reduce religion to just following the laws ... faith is a relationship, not a set of rules ... believing in Jesus and allowing love for him to translate into love for one's neighbors."

We are Disciple and walk as one with God when God's law takes deep root in our heart. We live in relationship with Jesus in prayer and worship and when we live to do his will – to "speak the truth from our heart ...," to serve those in need and work to eliminate the causes of our social ills. Disciple also accepts God's call 'to be compassionate and merciful as our heavenly Father is'. The parables of the Good Samaritan and the woman caught in adultery are the models of compassion and mercy that we follow. Justice and fairness are important but they must be applied in light of abundant mercy. Our mantras become, "I forgive", from the easiest to forgive to the most unforgiveable, and as Pope Francis says, "Who am I to judge?" It is then that we are Disciple; that we are 'first fruits of God's creation'; that we are "in the world but not of the world."

This week let's observe ourselves very closely for Pharisee-Disciple tendencies. Let's watch our behaviours, listen to the words, language and topics of our conversations and examine our thoughts and judgements those fleeting and those lingering. Build on our Disciple qualities and ask God's help to be faithful to the Disciple namesake and the discipleship to which we are called – to accept God's love for us, to love God, to love others, to be compassionate hearers and merciful doers of God's word.


# **CHILDREN'S RELIGIOUS EDUCATION**
