# **SUNDAY - September 3 2023** *Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time*

It is Labor Day weekend! Why all this talk of work on Labor Day weekend? Because work is good. The work we do to maintain ourselves, or for the sake of those we love, or to make a livelihood are all vital to what it means to be human. Daily, you and I produce something: maybe it is a meal, we bathe children—or elders. We may teach, take an order, preach a homily, plant seeds, pick vegetables. We give our time and attention to people who need it: family members, coworkers, sometimes strangers. We give our "living sacrifice of praise" to God—yes, our prayer is considered a form of work. The word *liturgy* means public work. On the face of it, according to this weekend's readings, the life of faith can be unpleasant. It grows out of deception, anger, rejection, and pain (Jeremiah); deprivation and thirst (the psalm); and involves sacrifice (Paul) and more rejection sacrifice (the gospel). But of course, there is more to it. Yearning and deprivation lead to glory; thirst too leads to a banquet; sacrifice to renewal; denial and the cross to kindness which "is a greater good than life."

In scripture today, we hear Jeremiah's lament about how hard it is to be a prophet—a job he never wanted, a labor he got drafted into and regrets often. Jeremiah felt "duped" by God because the people mocked him. Have you ever felt "duped" by God? Have you been able to examine that feeling more closely and come to a deeper understanding of your life's purpose? Paul asks us not to "conform to this age." How have you felt pressured in your own life to conform or not to "make waves"? How have you resisted mindless conformity? Have you ever sensed that a decision or commitment you made for the sake of the gospel would bring you hardship or suffering, as Jesus predicted it would for him. Peter does not like to suffer, so he cannot imagine that God might make use of human suffering for divine ends. The idea that fuller life might flower up from death has not occurred to him. Most of all, Peter interprets the proposed death of Jesus as the road to nowhere. Peter will feel vindicated in his trust if these three hard years are the price paid for establishing an earthly kingdom. But if this journey winds up in a brutal execution, the whole mission will have been worthless.

Each generation is at risk of conforming to the present age—a bad idea whatever age it might be. The present age is always passing, trapped in history, and limited by the nearsightedness of finite creatures. If our goal is to discern the will of God and to do it, living in harmony with "what is good and pleasing and perfect," clearing our lives of obstacles to the way of holiness is a prerequisite. "The renewal of the mind," as Paul terms it, involves surrendering

our habitual manner of thinking and being—a process that can feel very much like a death. Saint Augustine of Hippo wrote... there can only be two basic loves . . . the love of God unto the forgetfulness of self, or the love of self unto the forgetfulness and denial of God.
