SUNDAY September 6, 2020 Twenty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

In today's readings, we are called to be sentinels of God's truth in the world. As the body of Christ, baptized priest, prophet, and king, we are responsible for the well-being of one another. In today's individualistic world, this is an uncomfortable position to be in, yet we cannot sidestep our responsibilities, for our own lives are on the line!

God calls each of us to be living witnesses to God's truth through our thoughts, our words, and our actions. God also expects us to be accountable for others who have stumbled and lost their way. We are called to gently guide them back to the fold, not in judgment, but through God's wisdom, grace, and love. Dignity remains intact. The goal is always reconciliation, forgiveness, and conversion of heart for we are God's beloved, called to live in right relationship with God.

I just finished reading Austin Ivereigh's book, Wounded Shepherd Pope Francis and His Struggle to Convert the Catholic Church. Pope Francis models, with humility and love, the three steps for conversion Jesus outlines in Matthew's Gospel today. When Francis became pope, he didn't clean house and surround himself with those who supported his ideas of church. Rather, he engaged in "a hearts-and-minds conversion" with those around him in weeklong silent retreats using the Ignatian Spiritual Exercises, the art of discernment, and the space and time to be present to God's mercy and grace.

Ivereigh writes how Pope Francis summoned his bishops in Chile together using a prepared ten-page letter that he read out to them before giving it to them to go off and pray over. "The letter began by recalling God's original favor and mercy, asked the bishops to recognize where God had been rejected in favor of idols, and invited them to come home. He asked them to be honest and contrite, and to take responsibility rather than blaming and scapegoating. The only way forward was to assume the task synodally, as a body, walking together. We are gathered to discern, not to discuss, to discern the good and bad spirits, not to argue about who was right and wrong; and the sign that they had discerned well would be the true peace that was the fruit of seeking God's will. Theirs was a time of trial, but also of grace; a time to be liberated of false certainties and instead to listen to the voice of the Lord."

Pope Francis is not immune and when he realized how badly he had misread the Chilean church, he took full responsibility and begged forgiveness. He became aware of his sin, took responsibility to initiate action, and effected a positive change. "A pastor who admitted his errors rather than ignoring them or explaining them away was someone with the courage and credibility to lead the church where she needs to go."

Pope Francis used courage, discernment, humble listening, and plenty of prayer. He gave space for others to save face. We are called to love, to be love, to soften our hearts so the voice of God can saturate our being with generative, unconditional love as we journey together.
