

August 31, 2025

This Sunday, August 31st, is the 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time. The Gospel by Luke describes Jesus' visit to a Pharisee's house to share a meal. After observing the other guests, Jesus decided to speak. At first, Jesus appeared to be giving His listeners lessons in etiquette. When you are invited, go and sit down at the lowest place, so that when your host comes, he may say to you, 'Friend, move up higher.' In other words, choose the humble seat so that you will not be embarrassed. But the implications are far deeper than avoiding a little awkwardness. Jesus is letting all of us know that being humble within our hearts and souls is essential to enter the Kingdom of Heaven. To be truly humble is to be aware that all we accomplish and contribute is from God. If we forget this and start believing that we are more important than other people and that our opinion is more valuable than the opinion of others, we will lose the ability to listen, to connect, to encounter. The consequences will be much more serious than being asked at a gathering to sit at a lower place - we will forget the reason we were created, we will cut ourselves off from community, family and even God. So, what can we do to remain humble? How can we genuinely remain grounded and rooted in God? We can pray for the gift of humility and remember to thank God every moment of every day for everything - plums, music, oxygen, smiles, life - the list is endless! It is as infinitely long as the generosity of God is infinitely great.

But Jesus was not finished! After talking to the guests, Jesus had something to say to the Pharisee, the host. And it was quite surprising! When you give a luncheon or a dinner, do not invite your friends or your brothers or sisters or your relatives or rich neighbours, in case they may invite you in return and you would be repaid. We know that Jesus shared meals with His friends and disciples, so what do His words mean? Jesus is not telling us to avoid having dinner with our loved ones. But He is asking us to remember the people that are left out, the marginalized, the poor. Do we recognize the person who is suffering from poverty of friendship or poverty of employment? Father Leo Roberts (a former Pastor of Holy Cross Parish) was asked by some young people: "How can we be Christians in the 20th century when we have so much education, freedom and wealth." Father Leo responded: "You share!" You share with family, friends, neighbors, colleagues. You share with the sick, the hungry, the homeless, the refugees, the immigrants. You share your wealth, your time, your attention. You share your country, your space, your resources. You remember that it all comes from God. You remember that at the end of your earthly life only love and friendship can be carried into the eternal life with God.



Social & Ecological Justice Ministry Project: UVIC Food Insecurity

With the rising costs in academic studies and accommodations, media and on campus sources have reported that managing to survive as a student at UVic is becoming increasingly difficult. Education is essential but costs for purchasing basic food and personal care items can be prohibitive on a student budget.

With the assistance of our new UVic/Camosun Catholic Chaplin, Fr. David Shulist, S.J., our Social Justice committee (SEJC) has identified how our Holy Cross parishioners can help provide some basic relief for those students. At the Interfaith Chapel, nonperishable food and personal care items that have been donated from various sources are made available free to students in need. The need is growing.

Starting in September at Holy Cross, the SEJC will be organizing a collection of items in support of Food Security at UVic and will be appealing to the amazing generosity of our parishioners to purchase and donate these items by the last Saturday and Sunday of each month. Collection bins will be made available in the foyer at the entrance of the church. Delivery to the Interfaith Chapel will be appealed at the end of each month. Food provided will be appealed for different parts and at the end of each month.
