

## September 7, 2025

Today's gospel speaks of the cost of discipleship. Whoever comes to me and does not hate their father and mother, spouse and children, brothers and sisters, yes, even life itself, cannot be my disciples. My friends, the radical demands of Jesus in today's Gospel may strike us as quite unreal and make us feel uneasy. Rather than pushing them aside or taking them with a grain of salt, let us allow them to challenge us. These demands are not meant to discourage us. They are meant to encourage us, to urge us to make our discipleship of Jesus count for something rather than allowing it to slide into a faceless and colorless mediocrity. These demands are not meant to have us drown in the impossible. They are meant to convince us of what can be done, if we take our discipleship seriously.

What Jesus reminds us of today is that it is not enough for us, as his disciples, to stay in the middle of the road. He tells us that we must make choices that make us recognizable as his followers. To see such choices through, we are not left to our own powers; rather we can be confident that the power of the risen Jesus at work in us will enable us to be artisans of God's new world. It is for that same new world that Jesus gave totally of himself. It is for that same new world of God, that Jesus in turn, empowers us. The issue here is our discipleship of Jesus. That is serious business, not allowing for compromises. There is something unconditional in our being claimed by Jesus. It has everything to do with going the path that Jesus himself went. That is not a particularly easy or smooth path. If we try to go the path of truth, the path of fidelity, the path of respect and care for others, the path of forgiveness in our kind of world, then we know that there is a cost to it. There is no way of avoiding that cost, if our discipleship of Jesus is to be authentic.

Throughout history people have had to make hard choices about following Christ, choices that involved sacrifice. During the early Roman persecutions, many Christians renounced their faith to save their hides. In today's gospel, Jesus offers some difficult advice: "You have to carry a cross if you want to follow me." Discipleship is demanding. There is a priority of relationships and commitments in life. The decision to follow Christ cannot be taken half-heartedly.

Christianity is about surrendering into the arms of God—and on God's terms, not ours. "Not my will" is not just a slogan in the spiritual life of Jesus or his followers. When 12th-century King Henry II appointed his roguish and playboy friend, Thomas à Becket, as Archbishop of Canterbury because he felt that such an appointment would guarantee his control over …[Continued on page 3]
