## October 12, 2025

This Sunday, October 12<sup>th</sup>, is the 28<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time. Luke's Gospel tells the story of ten lepers who approached Jesus and from a distance asked Him to have mercy on them. Jesus responded by sending them to show themselves to the priests. And as they went, they were made clean. How happy and relieved the ten lepers must have been. Having leprosy was a terrible thing! Not only did this disease lead to nerve damage and disfigurement, but lepers were completely ostracized from their families and communities. Jesus' healing of the ten lepers was an act of compassion and love. Surprisingly only one of the lepers returned to thank Jesus and praise God for the miraculous cure. Jesus asked: "Were not nine made clean? But the other nine, where are they?" Jesus was not asking for thanks for himself but for praise for God. At first it is hard to believe that only one healed person returned to glorify God. But, maybe in their joy, the other nine rushed home to see their families and show them that they were healed. Considering their suffering, their behaviour was quite understandable! Nevertheless, by not taking the time to express their gratitude, the other nine lepers missed out.

Jesus said to the healed leper who prostrated himself at Jesus' feet, "Get up and go on your way; your faith has made you well." It was the leper's faith that initially gave him the courage to cry out to Jesus for mercy. And Jesus healed him. Then it was the healed leper's faith that led him to thank Jesus and praise God. And Jesus healed him from bitterness, fear, and resentment. Jesus healed him from attitudes that he could have developed from his suffering as a leper. Jesus opened the heart of the healed leper to joy, forgiveness, understanding and acceptance. Because of gratitude! Being grateful, being appreciative, taking the time to praise God brings healing and peace. God does not need our praise, but we need to praise and thank God. When we remember that everything we have, everything we do and create and everything we love, comes from God, then we find deep peace and joy.

Luke's Gospel had one more key point. The leper that returned to praise God was not a Jew. He was a foreigner, a Samaritan! The Jewish people considered the religious practices of the Samaritans appalling. They believed that the Samaritans were impure and treated them with hostility. But it was the Samaritan who returned to praise God, and he received the additional healing that Jesus offered because he expressed his gratitude. After thanking Jesus, the healed Samaritan went on his way to see his family. This is a valuable reminder to all of us that we can not judge the hearts of anyone, including people of different faiths, cultures, lifestyles, and ethnicities. Instead, with God's grace we open our hearts to every person, no matter who they are and discover that they, too, carry Jesus within their being.
