

October 26, 2025

This Sunday, October 26th, is the 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time. To-day's Gospel by Luke continues the discussion on prayer that was started last Sunday. Last week Jesus recommended that we pray unceasingly. This week Jesus reminds us that a humble attitude when praying is essential. He used a parable to illustrate what he meant. In the parable two men were praying in the temple. One was a Pharisee, and he thanked God for how wonderful he was and told God all the great and good things he was doing. The other was a tax collector asking God for mercy, obviously distraught by his sinfulness. After describing the scene in the temple, Jesus made it unambiguously clear. The tax collector went down to his home justified rather than the other; for whoever exalts himself will be humbled, but whoever humbles himself will be exalted. The listeners of this parable must have been surprised, maybe even uncomfortable. Tax collectors were scorned because they acted on behalf of the enemy, the Romans.

None of us think of ourselves as terrible people and we are probably not. But we are sinners. We are not always generous with our time and wealth. We have moments of anger, hold on to grudges and ignore the needs of people right in front of us. But this is not the impediment to prayer. When we acknowledge that we have failed to love, Jesus is always ready to forgive. The problem is thinking of ourselves as better than others. Yes, we are not thieves, rogues, adulterers, but this is not of our own doing. It is God's spirit which has enabled us to make good choices and helped us to live in harmony with others and creation as best we can. Like the Pharisee we have been gifted with education, people who care about us and guide us, good jobs, and enough wealth to live comfortably. We have no idea what others have suffered that has led them to make poor choices. We never have the right to judge. There but for the grace of God go I (John Bradford). If the Pharisee had prayed with a humble heart, he might have said: "God, I thank you for all the beautiful and wonderful things you have given me. I am full of gratitude for your love and mercy. Help me to see what I can do to love you more and grow closer to you. Help me become aware of how I can help your people and build your kingdom. I am deeply sorry for anything that I have done that hurt you, your people, and your creation. I know that the poor one called and the Lord heard. I am one of your poor ones."

What if we have caused a serious hurt to another person or to creation? Then, like the tax collector, we approach God with a humble and contrite heart and ask for forgiveness. And like the tax collector we will go home justified and forgiven. The prayer of the humble pierces the clouds, and it will not rest until it reaches its goal.


